



TEMPLE RULES



DO'S



Remove footwear at the side-entrance of the temple.

Wash your hands & feet before entering the temple.

Ring the bell (if you wish) when you enter the temple.

Perform the prayers.

If you have any offerings, please do inform the priest at the temple. Prasad can be served in the temple premises outside the hall.

Please show your respect towards the culture and temple by following a proper dress code.

Clothing should be worn that conveys an image of well-presented, respectable, maintaining the rich culture, and devotion towards God that best suits to a beautiful, holy & divine place – the temple.

Cooperation from devotees is required to keep the temple premises clean and tidy at all times.

Parents shall supervise children at all times and make sure that children do not cause any disturbance or damages at the premises.

All activities shall be in keeping with the dignity and respect for the sanctity of a holy place and according to Hindu Traditions and rites.

The person who has booked an event in the Temple shall be solely and fully responsible for all actions, behaviour and conduct of all its guests and invited visitors at the premises.

DONT'S



Please DO NOT park your cars in driveways or at bus stops.

Please DO NOT pluck any flowers or Tulsi leaves from the Temple premises.

Please DO NOT leave footwear right in front of the temple entrance.

Please DO NOT ring the bell when you are leaving the temple - your back being towards the deities.

Please DO NOT wear unacceptable clothing to the temple viz., garments made from see-through materials, low waist pants/skirts, singlets, etc.

Please DO NOT bring any offerings that are most likely to spill on the carpet.

e.g Soanpapdi, sweets with syrup, etc.

All food served in the temple premises shall be **Sattvick** (No Garlic and Onions)

Please DO NOT leave your rubbish out anywhere in the temple premises – Use proper bins.

Please DO NOT leave any Prasad items outside in the temple premises on the floor, benches or under the benches.

NO item should be borrowed or removed from the temple premises.

NO household items should be left in the temple premises. After performing special puja/ceremonies, do not leave any items (e. g. picture of deity, puja related materials, pots, pans, leftover in the temple premises.

NO alcohol shall be brought onto the premises of the Temple under any circumstances

Smoking, non-vegetarian food or alcoholic beverages will NOT be allowed in the temple complex.
